An Example of Different Colours. The following is an example of a program that produces output with different colours. Copy it and save it as **Colours.html**.

```
<HTML>
  <HEAD>
    <TITLE>Colours</TITLE>
  </HEAD>
  <BODY>
    <FONT COLOR = "red">
      This text should be red.
    <FONT COLOR = "blue">
      This text should be blue.
    <FONT COLOR = "yellow">
      This text should be yellow.
  </BODY>
</HTML>
```

Background and Text Colours

An Example of Background and Text Colours. The following is an example of a program that produces output with different coloured background and text. Copy it and save it as **Background.html**.

```
<HTML>
  <HEAD>
    <TITLE>Background and Text</TITLE>
  </HEAD>
  <BODY BGCOLOR = "black" TEXT = "white">
    The background should be black.<BR>
    The text should be white.
  </BODY>
</HTML>
```

Exercise: Change the BGCOLOR and TEXT parameters to make other colour combinations.

Using Images for Background

An Example of Using an Image as Background. The following is an example of a program that uses an image file as background. Copy it and save it as **Image Background.html**.

```
<HTML>
  <HEAD>
    <TITLE>Using an Image as a Background</TITLE>
  </HEAD>
  <BODY BACKGROUND = "Image.gif" TEXT = "red"> (Use your image file.)
    The background should be an image.<BR>
    The text should be red.
  </BODY>
</HTML>
```

Experiment with other images and text colours.
